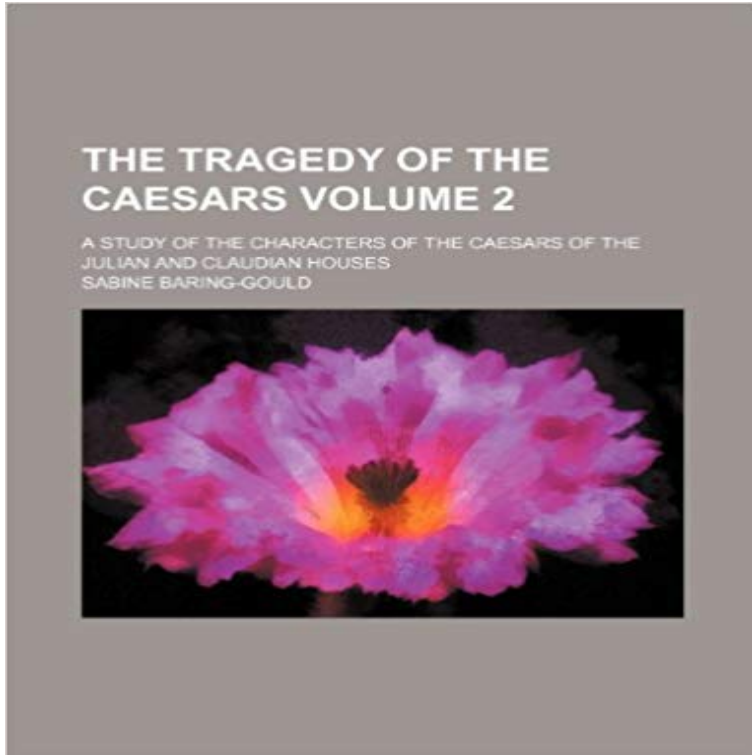

Pliny and Suetonius give further details. The hostile fleets were supposed to represent those of the Sicilians and Rhodians. On elevated seats in splendid apparel sat the emperor, Agrippina, and Nero. Britannicus is not mentioned. The 1 Tacitus himself informs us that the charges of undue familiarity between Pallas and the empress were made by this disappointed and envious man.
