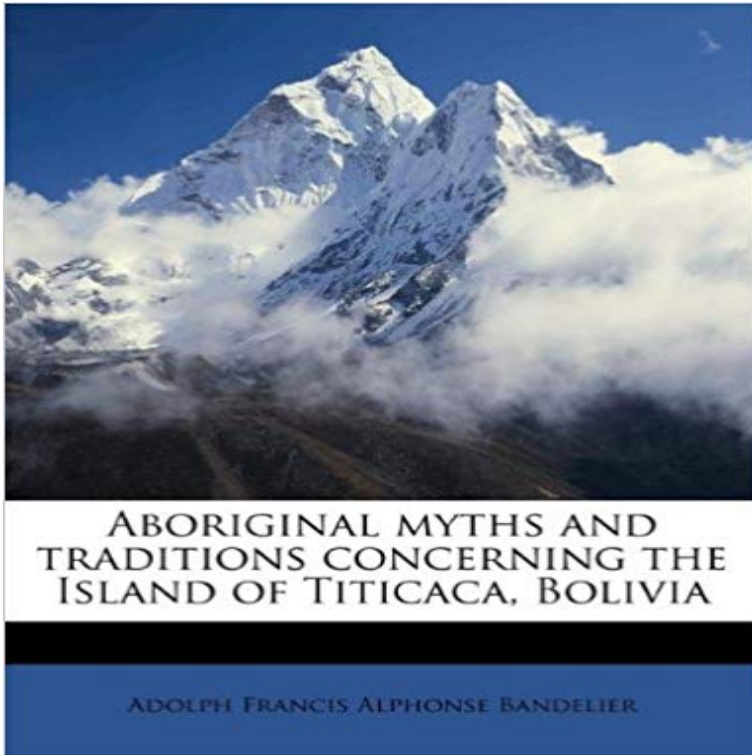


Aboriginal myths and traditions concerning the Island of Titicaca, Bolivia
