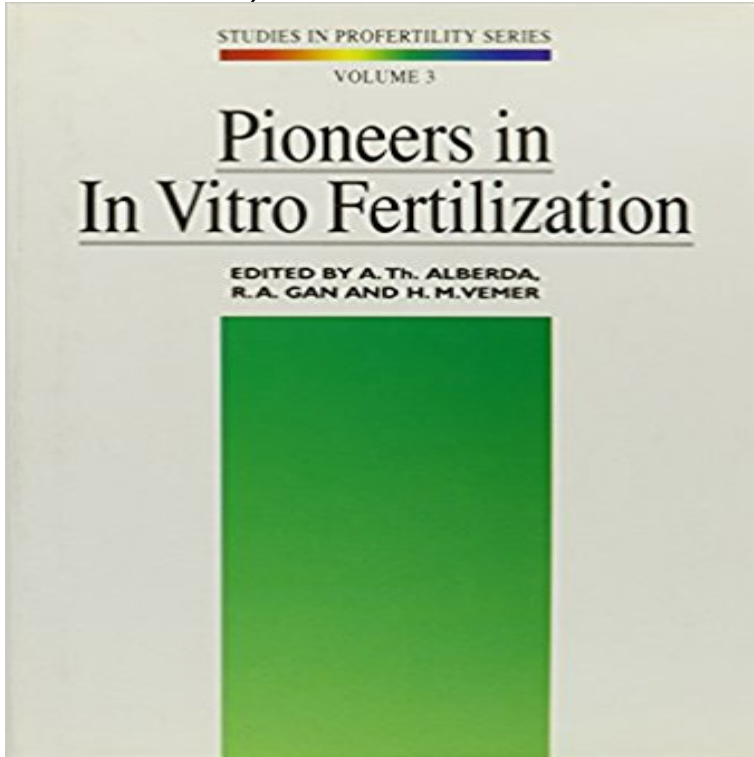


Pioneers in In Vitro Fertilization (Society and Culture in the Modern Middle East)
