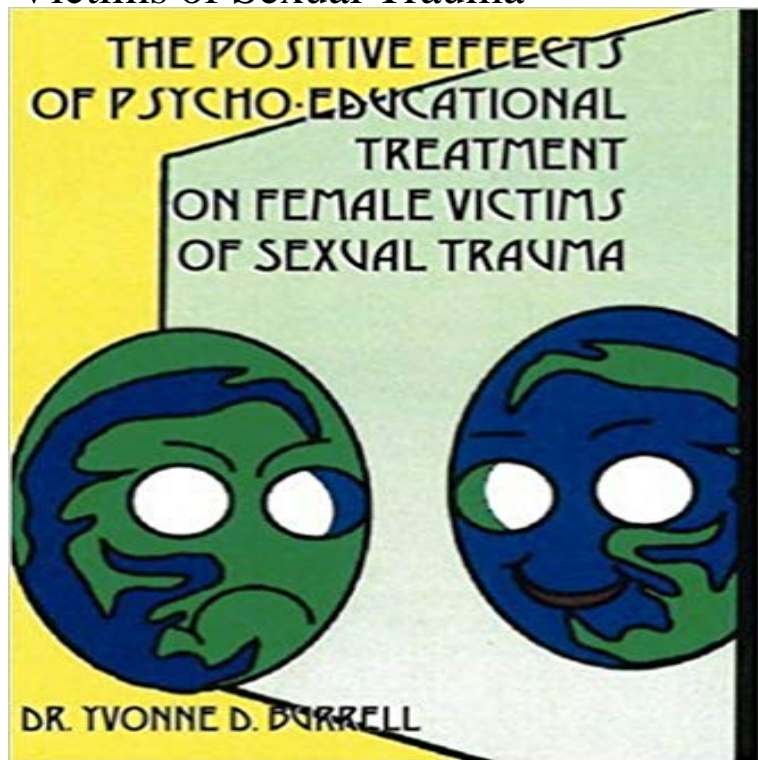


The Positive Effects of Psycho-Educational Treatment on Female Victims of Sexual Trauma
